New York City's Frank Rivera, Jr. presented the critical design concerns with the proper application of condensing boiler to new and existing building systems. Frank discussed in depth topics such as return water temperature, temperature drop, flue material design concerns, system pressure, and outside air reset of system temperature. After the presentation, we toured the warehouse to see the logistics of managing the sales of several different types of mechanical products.



Our very own Stephanie O'Dea presented on ASHRAE's Indoor Air Quality standards. Stephanie presented a 2 hr seminar on all aspects of IAQ calculation, guidelines, strategies, and techniques in both commercial and residential applications. The Seminar took place in Mechanical Heating Supply's training room, which included exposed radiant floor heating, a condensing boiler and distribution system, and viewing panels to the ductwork and heating distribution system.
